(The asset owner may use another system)		
Orange/yellow disc or marking	8a. or 8b.	i. Capable of supporting normal loads but not design loads
Red disc or marking	8b.	ii. Could fail under normal loads

- 6. What process or techniques do you use if you believe a pole has been wrongly tagged?
- 7. Do you see any benefit in standardisation across the industry?
