Public Safety Working Group – 45001 Workstream

2020 Priority Objective : Support public safety compliance for organizations and great public safety outcomes by meaningful audits that provide operational improvements

Industry fed back to the EEA a level of frustration at the quality of auditing delivered through NZS 7901 – Safety management systems for public safety

Working group discussed with regulator on options under the regulations and whether certification to 45001 could meet the requirements

AS/NZS 45001 Workstream – To produce a guide outlining specific public safety requirements

51 Audit of safety management systems

-) Every safety management system must be regularly audited to confirm whether-
 - (a) the safety management system complies with NZS 7901 or regulations 49 and 50, as appropriate; and
 - (b) the safety management system operator is implementing and maintaining the safety management system as written; and
 - (c) the effect of the safety management system is to prevent, so far as is reasonably practicable, the works from presenting a significant risk of—
 - (i) serious harm to any member of the public; or
 - (ii) significant damage to property owned by a person other than the safety management system operator.
